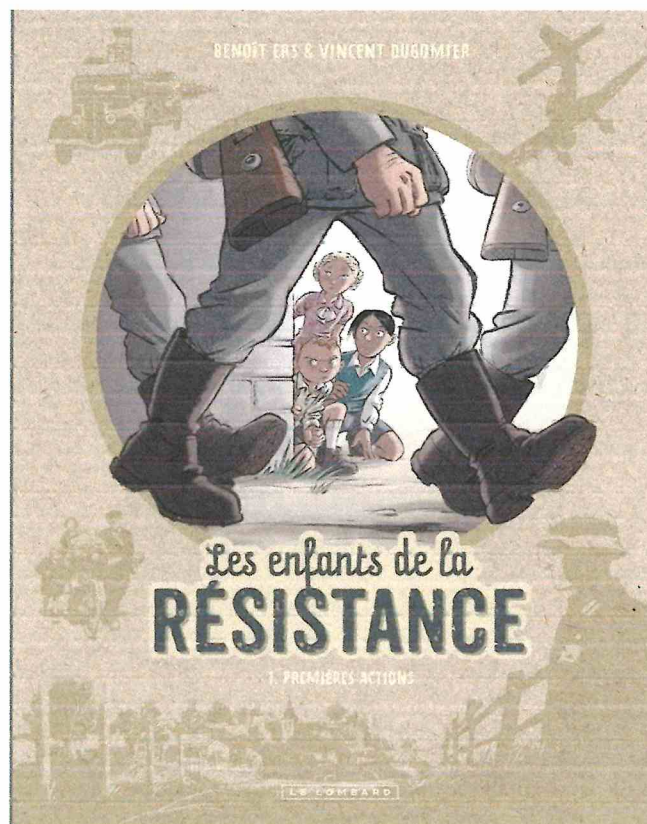

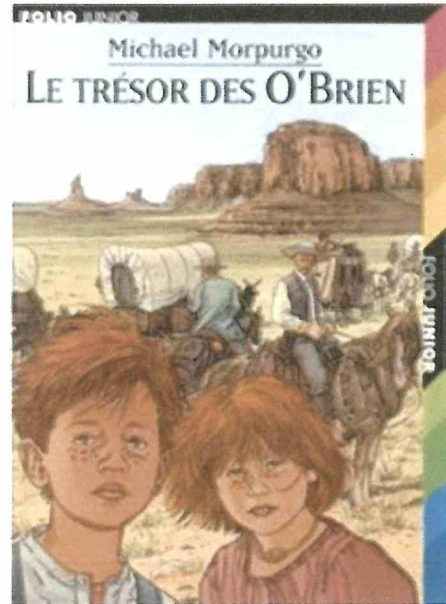

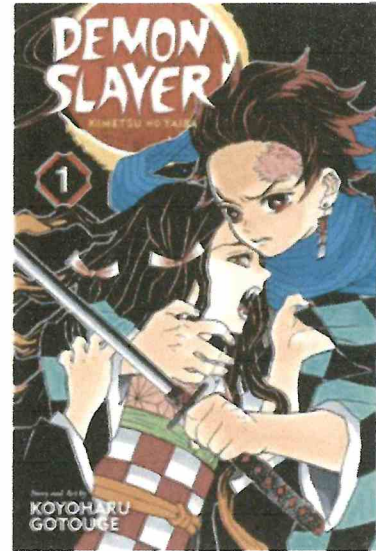
Michael Morpurgo delivers a moving story that mixes adventure with historical facts. The depiction of the Irish famine and the hardships of emigrants is particularly immersive. Sean and Annie are lovable protagonists and their bravery and resilience make for an inspiring read. However, some critics argue that the story may be simplistic for adult readers, though it remains well-suited for younger audiences.

To sum up, *Twist of Gold* is an engaging historical novel that sheds light on a dark period in Irish history through the eyes of two brave children. It offers an emotional and educational adventure, making it an excellent choice for young readers interested in History and survival stories.

Demon Slayer - Kimetsu No Yaiba by Koyoharu Gotouge

It's the story of Cherry Costello. She moved from her old house because her father, Paddy, has a new wife. They moved to a very big manor of the new family of Cherry.

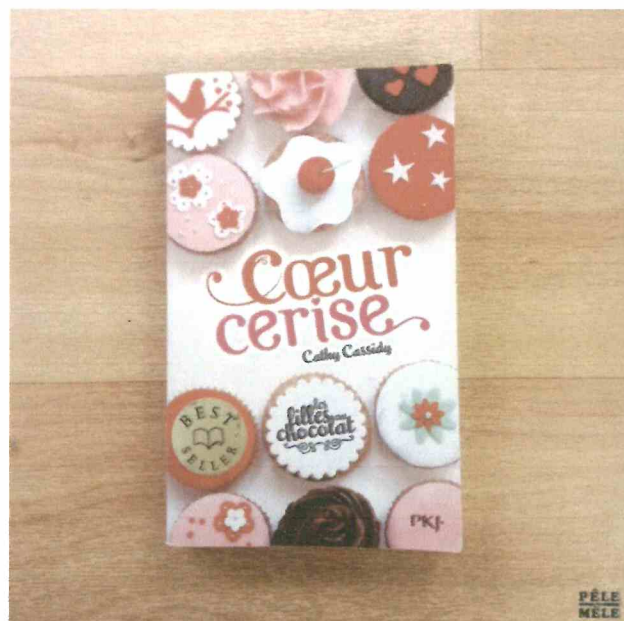

Finally, I recommend this book if you like reading adventures.

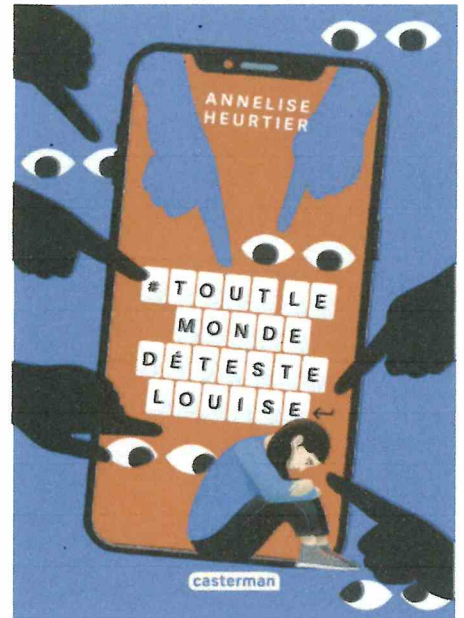
